FALL GRANTS AWARDED

Giving Back

The Fall Grants were announced and awarded at the Wahanks for Giving+reception on November 10. Awards were presented as follows:

The Preservation society of Union City—\$4,000

This grant provides support for the Jeremiah Smith statue to be located at the Carnegie Library in downtown Union City.

Farmland United Methodist Women/Monroe Central After School Tutoring—\$500

This grant provides funds to assist with teaching expenses and certified staff for the After-School Tutoring program.

Art Association of Randolph County—\$2,000

This grant helps fund the Al Simmons visit to all Randolph County Grade Schools. Al Simmons has a unique way of teaching music, art and science to young children.

Second Harvest Food Bank of East Central Indiana, Inc.—\$500 This grant assists Second Harvest in providing food for residents of Randolph county through the Tailgate program.

Winchester Friends Church on behalf of Winchester Area Churches and Community Food Pantry—\$2,000

This grant provides funds for the purchase of food and the continuation of operations for the food pantry

A total of \$9,000 was awarded, including \$4,000 from the Community Foundation Enrichment Fund and \$5,000 from the Union City Community Fund.

Community Foundation of Randolph County becomes a Regional Arts Partner for the Indiana Arts Commission.

Starting January 1, CFRC will be the IAC Regional Arts Partner for Region 5. CFRC will oversee the granting process for the region and will provide technical assistance and workshops for the arts organizations in the region. Funds for Arts Organizations are appropriated from the Indiana State Legislature in conjunction with the National Endowment for the Arts.

"We are very excited by the opportunity to have the Community Foundation of Randolph County represent the Commission and serve the cultural needs in Region Five," said IAC Executive Director Lewis C. Ricci. "Partnering with a community foundation provides a proven track record of program development and grants management that will be invaluable to this region."



The Rickert Shierling Fund represents two people who understand the value of education, Elizabeth Rickert Shierling and Tom Shierling. This educational fund, housed at the Community Foundation of Randolph County, will assist Randolph County residents who value education for years to come.

Tom Shierling received the Best Scholarship in 1963, which helped to finance his music education at Indiana University. He never forgot how much that aid meant to him during college. So, over the years, the idea of £arrying forwardqwas always in the back of my mind,+he explained.

Tomos mother, Elizabeth Rickert Shierling, was an educator for over 30 years and helped to instill the importance and value he had for learning. Upon her death in February 2011, Tom established the fund that he had been considering for a while. The fund provided a means for donations in memory of his mother which has enabled it to grow

Tom plans to fully establish the fund through a bequest. Financial planning now provides the opportunity for him to eventually give \$5,000 through the fund on an annual basis to promote educational opportunities in Randolph County.

This particular fund is open to all Randolph County residents, not just high school seniors. The fund will provide assistance for those going to college, returning to college, starting college late, and will support continuing education such as attendance at conferences and seminars. It does give preference to those interested in studying human sexuality or secular humanism.

FALL 2011 ACTIVITIES AT CFRC

In September, the Womence Fund sponsored its first Walk Winchester for Women event. Sponsored by the Athena Club, Drs. Marty Sulek and Alison Syme, First Merchants Bank, Gail F. Stewart, O.D., On the Square, Randolph County YMCA, Winchester Kiwanis Club and Winchester Rotary Club; all proceeds benefit the Fund which will provide grants for the encouragement and empowerment of women and girls in Randolph County.

In October, the Foundation and the Literacy Coalition delivered 1,764 books to every 2nd through 6th grade student in the 10 elementary and middle schools of Randolph County, including Mississinawa Valley School. Second graders received the Scholastic Readers, Third graders received dictionaries, Fourth graders received a classic, Fifth graders received an atlas and Sixth graders received a thesaurus. CFRC grants provide books for 3rd, 5th and 6th grades and the Coalition provides books for 2nd and 4th.

November was Whanks for Giving+, a Donor Appreciation reception held at the new Towne Square Community Centre. The purpose of this event was to thank all who have donated to the Foundation. It is through donations of individuals and businesses to CFRCs various funds that CFRC is able to provide grants, scholarships and books to Randolph County organizations and students.
