## 2009 Lilly Scholarship Recipients Named



Katie Miller, Randolph Southern Hiah School. and Jack Union Cummings, Citv Community High School, were selected as the 2009 Lilly Endowment Scholarship recipients. Katie plans to attend Manchester College and to major in Education. Jack plans University attend Indianapolis and to major in archaeology.

Lilly Recipients receive full tuition to any school in Indiana, along with required fees and an \$800 stipend for books. Selection is made by a committee of nine individuals, some of whom belong to the Community Foundation Board of Directors some of whom are from the general public.

Pictured to the right are the 10 Lilly Finalists. The 10 finalists are selected by the committee on the written applications. Prior to the committee receiving the applications, all identifying information is blacked out SO the student cannot be identified. This year 23 applications were received. The 10 finalists are interviewed and the recipients chosen through numerical process.

To qualify for the Lilly Scholarship, a student must maintain at least a 3.5 GPA.

# **Spring 2009 Grant Awards**

The Community Foundation of Randolph County announced grant awards for the Spring 2009 cycle on May 7 at a public reception held at the Lions Club in Lynn. A total of \$14,500 were presented, \$9,000 of which was from the Union City Community Fund and \$5,000 from the Community Enrichment Fund.

Awards are as follows:

**Drug Free Randolph County—\$2,000** to help fund attendance by Randolph County students to the 2009 summer Indiana Teen Institute, a leadership/prevention program where students will develop leadership skills to bring back to their schools for positive change.

**Mid-America Athletic Association—\$500** to help purchase new uniforms and continue the growth of the youth tackle football program.

**Union City Fire Department—\$1,000** to purchase Fire and EMS training software for training adjuncts for realistic preparation of needed skills.

**Community Christmas— \$1,500** to help with costs associated with the annual holiday celebration, specifically extending the infrastructure to the east end of Harter Park.

Union City Community Economic Development Committee—\$1,000 to sponsor a presentation by Jack Shultz for Randolph and Darke Counties on June 16.

Randolph County Law Enforcement Youth Leadership Camp—\$1,000 to assist with the costs of running the 2009 Leadership Camp.

**Saratoga Little League—\$1,000** to assist with expansion of the facilities in Saratoga, including an outfield fence and small storage building.

**The Randy Players—\$3,000** to assist with carpet replacement at Hoosier Place auditorium.

**Pregnancy Care Center of Randolph County— \$500** to assist with the start an abstinence program for area youth.

Randolph County YMCA—\$1,500 to assist with the Y RS Kids Club Program start up expenses for the Lynn Community.

In addition, the Board approved funding at a minimum level for all scholarships that did not have an available balanced due to the drop in the market.

# CFRC SELECTED FOR COMMUNITY OF EFFECTIVE PRACTICE PILOT PROGRAM

The Community Foundation of Randolph County is one of seven state-wide Foundations chosen to participate in the Community of Effective Practice Pilot Project. This project is a program of Indiana Grantmakers and other participating foundations include Wayne County, Jay County, Greater Ft. Wayne, South Madison, Wabash Valley and Washington County.

All participating Foundations have been recognized for being in

compliance with National Standards. This is a two-year project, during which time the foundations will reassess professional standards and policies and prepare for re-certification. The Foundations will receive professional development, opportunities for on-site visits to other foundations to assist in assessment, networking opportunities and the ability to establish a framework for continuous improvement.
