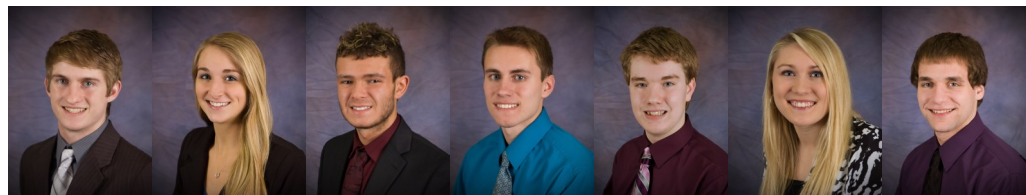

## 2013 Lilly Scholarship Awarded to WCHS Senior Taryn Saulman

The Community Foundation proudly announces the recipients of the Spring 2012 Competitive Grant Cycle. The Spring Grant Awards were presented to the following organizations during a reception May 17 at the Community Foundation:

**Camp Yale—\$3,000**

To support the Summer Nature Day Camp Program. This grant was provided through the Community Foundation Enrichment Fund and the Union City Community Fund.

**East Central Indiana Festivals, Inc (JazzFest) - \$2,500**

For the purchase of stage sections to be used for Festival entertainment. The stage sections will also be available to other community organizations. This grant provided through the Community Foundation Enrichment Fund

**Historic Farmland, USA—\$1,000**

To provide support for three theatrical productions in downtown Farmland.

**PAWS Animal Rescue—\$4,000**

To assist in the completion of the new animal shelter facility in Union City. This grant provided through the Union City Community Fund.

**State Line Heritage Days—\$3,000**

To assist with the costs of entertainment for the 2012 State Line Heritage Days Festival, August 1-4. This grant provided through the Union City Community Fund.

**Winchester Area Churches and Community Food Pantry—\$800**

To support the costs of childcare, workbooks, supplies and materials for the RC-EPIC Getting Ahead program. This grant provided through the Community Foundation Enrichment Fund.

A total of \$14,300 was awarded, \$5,000 from the Community Foundation Enrichment Fund and \$9,300 from the Union City Community Fund.

The Enrichment Fund was established through gifts and Lilly Endowment match as an unrestricted fund with a primary purpose of providing grants to county non-profit organizations. This fund continues to grow through gifts from individuals and corporations.

The Union City Community Fund began when the old hospital was sold in Union City. The proceeds of the sale started the fund for the purpose of supporting Union City Community non-profits and their projects.
