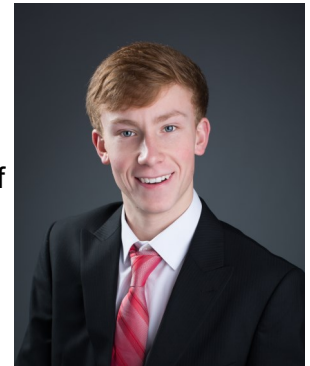

2014 Lilly Scholarship Awarded to Monroe Central High School Senior Jentry Flesher

Jentry Flesher will attend Purdue University this fall without having to worry about tuition, books and required fees. As recipient of the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship he is guaranteed a 4-year college education with these covered. Jentry plans to study Ag Systems Management to learn farming techniques. He is the son of Joel and Jane Flesher of Parker City.



Jentry is the first Lilly Recipient from Monroe Central High School in 10 years. When the announcement was made over the loudspeaker, applause could be heard coming from the classrooms.

The Lilly Alternates are: Evan Sowinski of Union City Community High School. He is planning to attend Purdue University to major in chemistry. He is the son of Kenneth and Theresa Sowinski of Union City; and Chase Bly, from Monroe Central. He plans to attend Ball State University to major in pre-med and then attend Indiana University with the goal of becoming a physician's assistant. He is the son of Andrew and Amanda Bly of Parker City. Evan and Chase will each receive a \$2,000 scholarship from the Community Foundation. Finalists Alex Myers and Blake Moore will each receive a \$1,500 scholarship and the remaining scholars will each receive a \$1,000 scholarship.

SPRING 2014 GRANTS AWARDED

The Community Foundation of Randolph County awarded a total of \$37,000 in Grants at a reception held at the Arts Depot on May 20, 2014. Organizations receiving grants are as follows:

Art Association of Randolph County—\$3,000 from the Union City Community Fund to purchase equipment to enhance meetings and events

Habitat for Humanity of Greater Richmond and Randolph County—\$4,500—to assist with the cost of materials used to rehabilitate the house at 802 North Main street, Winchester.

Jay County Special Olympics—\$1,400—to assist 4 Randolph County residents to attend and participate in the USA Special Olympics in Princeton, NJ.

The Journey Home—\$3,500—to assist with the purchase of laser printers, computers, fax machine and office supplies.

Main Street Christian Church on behalf of Boy Scouts Pack 58—\$585—to purchase recognition awards and camping supplies

Monroe Central Little League—\$3,600—to replace fencing for the little league diamonds

P.A.W.S. Animal Shelter—\$4,000 from the Union City Community fund—to complete the shelter, including guttering, security system and additional fencing.

Randolph County Historical Society—\$3,000 to assist with the labor expenses for outside maintenance of the landmark museum, including soffit and fascia.

Randolph County Literacy Coalition—\$1,000 (\$500 from the Union City Community Fund) to assist with the purchase of books for Randolph County Schools.

Second Harvest Food Bank—\$1,000—to assist in distribution of produce and grocery products through the Tailgate Program of Randolph County

State Line Heritage Days—\$6,000 from the Union City Community Fund to provide entertainment for the 2014 State Line Heritage Days festival.

State of the Heart Hospice—\$1,200 from the Union City Community Fund to support the costs of Randolph County Children attending Camp BEARable.

Winchester Friends Church on behalf of the Winchester Area Churches and Community Food Pantry—\$4,215—to purchase food for the food pantry

All grants are provided through the Community Foundation of Randolph County from its Enrichment Fund or from the Union City Community Fund.
