Randolph County Hero Nominations

The News-Gazette and the Community Foundation of Randolph County continue their celebration of local heroes who have made an impact on the community or have gone above and beyond expectations to serve others. This effort is the result of a community foundation program that helps recognize such people while also raising money to help others.

"We thought a really neat thing would be to create a list of Randolph County Heroes," said Community Foundation board member Cathy Stephen Miller of the ongoing program which started in 2015. "For \$1,000, anyone can nominate a person (living or deceased), organization, business, or community organization for the designation as a Randolph County Hero. Spectacular Donor Spotlight

Chris and Doreen Culy

Chris and Doreen Culy are significant proponents of creating growth in Randolph County. Their business ventures have allowed them to become one of the largest employers in the area, fulfilling their mission of creating rewarding jobs for people in their hometown. Chris believes that flourishing local businesses is one of the best ways to keep native Hoosiers in the county and possibly draw new ones in. In addition to promoting the wellbeing of our community by providing jobs, the Culy's have greatly impacted local organizations, like the YMCA, through their generous donations. After meeting with the Foundation Executive Director in 2019, Doreen decided that the best way to further their philanthropic efforts was to create their own unrestricted endowment fund that could be utilized at the Foundation's discretion. As a result, they established the Chris & Doreen Culy Family Charitable Fund in late January with hopes that this endowment will help sustain Randolph County non-profits for years to come. Doreen also supports the Foundation in another endeavor close to her heart, helping kids better themselves through education. From the establishment of the Randolph County Promise Community Fund in 2018 through the CollegeChoice 529 Savings Plan Program to the present, Doreen has invested in this cause. She created 529s for both of her sons in order to give them the opportunity for higher education if they chose that path and believes that every child should be provided with that same hope for achieving their future aspirations. Chris and Doreen have loved experiencing the impact of their efforts so far and believe that their giving has been a blessing to both them and those that have received the fruit of their donations.

They appreciate the presence of the Foundation as an overseer of many diverse funds, allowing community members, such as themselves, to contribute to causes that are important to them.

A Good Neighbor: EDP Renewables

EDP Renewables North America (EDPR) announced a \$125,000 donation to the Community Foundation of Randolph County on November 12, 2019 as part of its ongoing commitment to the Randolph County community. EDPR's donation was also part of a 2-1 match, allowing the Community Foundation to take full advantage of Lilly Endowment's GIFT VII Matching Grant Program. Community foundations are made possible when people and organizations give back to their community like EDPR is doing with this gift.

During the annual donor appreciation event, EDPR Executive Vice President Ryan Brown publicly announced the \$125,000 donation and shared the positive impact EDPR's planned Headwaters II Wind Farm and Riverstart Solar Park will have on Randolph County.

"EDP Renewables believes in being a good neighbor and supporting the communities that host our wind farms and solar parks, explained EDPR's Brown. "We are building enough clean energy capacity in Randolph County to power more than 150,000 Indiana homes and this donation is one way for us to thank the residents of Randolph County."

"The newly established EDP Renewables Charitable Fund is a permanent investment in Randolph County, allowing the Community Foundation to award grant dollars to improve the lives of the residents of the County, today, tomorrow, and forever," said Lisa Jennings, Executive Director of the Community Foundation of Randolph County. "The EDP Renewables Charitable Fund, made possible by EDPR, is endowed, meaning that the foundation invests the money and uses the gains from those investments to do good things in our community year after year. It is like EDPR is making a gift that will continually give back to our community for years and decades. Wind and solar energy are all about sustainability and this gift from EDPR is about charitable sustainability for our County."

EDPR is continuing a tradition of support, as the company has previously donated to the Community Foundation of Randolph County's Randolph County Promise program, a program designed to encourage students to begin thinking about and preparing for vocational or college education after high school.

Lilly Endowment Community Leadership Grant

Starting in early 2019, Community Foundation of Randolph County (CFRC) had the opportunity to apply for more funds through Lilly Endowment's GIFT Phase VII for community leadership grants. This component included both planning and implementation grants, which are intended to help the Foundation deepen its understanding of the challenges and opportunities facing its community; convene key local stakeholders and explore how it can effectively play a leadership role in implementing initiatives and strategies that enhance the quality of life in Randolph County.



The 3 main components for the \$50,000 planning grant are:

Increasing Community knowledge and connections: We entered into a partnership/contract with the Indiana Communities Institute of Ball State University alongside Randolph County United to further engage our community in a discussion on what our assets and needs are. This will result in a plan that will help shape grant making decisions for CFRC as well as help the county plan for our future. Our Lilly Endowment GIFT Phase VII Planning Committee for this grant is comprised of CFRC Executive Director/CEO Lisa Jennings, CFRC board members Bob Gentry, Cathy Stephen Miller and Dakota Crabtree. Along with Randolph County United, a 25-person group representing the county attend customized Community Development Training offered by Indiana Communities Institute of Ball State. The collaborative training included representation from CFRC, RCEDC, our five school systems, city and county government officials, local tourism, Winchester Main Street and more. The goal is to learn more about community development and opportunities garnered from the ongoing Cultivating Community efforts.

Increase knowledge and skills: CFRC engaged a consultant who worked with our board to ensure a common understanding of the roles within the Foundation. After learning more about the culture, capacity and, desires of CFRC, the consultant worked with CFRC to understand the various opportunities for further engagement in leadership in Randolph County that match our capacity with needs identified by the Cultivating Community effort. The intent is to further strengthen the collaboration between the CFRC, Randolph County United and Ball State/ICI for an even more powerful partnership.

Increase internal capacity: In order to allow more time for community development planning and work, we implemented new software program (and related training) to streamline our process for scholarships and grants. This work currently is done in-house by CFRC Program Officer and it is quite time-consuming for this position, the Applicants and for the Committees involved. The goal of implementing a new system is in the fall of 2020. This new system will provide efficiencies and move the Foundation forward in stronger and better interaction between our communities' non-profit partners within both these important areas of work of the foundation. The greater our focus on leadership related initiatives the more likely this will impact overall programs of the Foundation.

We look forward to the opportunities in the future with Community Leadership initiatives!

As community foundations face regulation at the state and the federal level, the accreditation program provides an additional layer of rigorous, sector-driven and enforced accountability.

The Accreditation Seal is only awarded to those community foundations that continue to meet comprehensive standards. Those receiving the Accreditation Seal have demonstrated their commitment to the success and well-being of every cause and person they support, and are willing and able to stand by every grant they have made. Dollars set aside for charity are limited. The Accreditation Seal signals to donors and to their professional advisers that a community foundation is a sound place to give and make a difference. 92 percent of the nation's largest community foundations participate in the National Standards Program. All community foundations receiving accreditation must meet 26 National Standards. Updated in 2014, these standards show that the Community Foundation of Randolph County, Inc. strives to achieve operational excellence.
