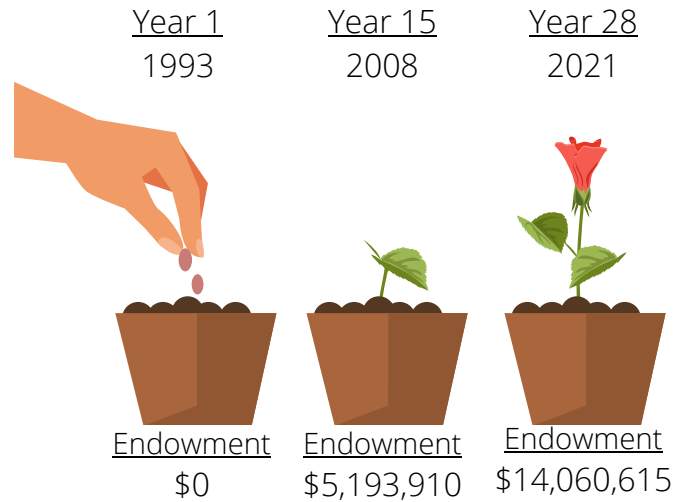
Our vision is to improve the quality of life in Randolph County through generosity that lasts for generations.

It all began in 1993. That's when the Community Foundation of Randolph County was planted in Randolph County and when our endowment was born. At that time, endowments were not a new idea-most every well-known university had one; Harvard University's is one of the most well-known. But it was a novel idea for a community to have an endowment of their own. Fast forward to 2021 and endowments are the specialty of the 700+ community foundations currently across the nation. That's why, since our founding, we have been on a mission to build the communities endowment to ensure impactful grant making forever.

Just like planting a seed, endowments can also grow, if properly tended to like ours has been. Historically, we have heard that the first Board of Directors had hoped that we could one day grow an endowment as large as \$5M. Yet here we are in 2021 with over \$14M in assets and a grand total of \$8,263,610.59 has been distributed through grantmaking since our inception to help our local nonprofits help others! Obviously, we could not have done any of this without generous donors like you - so thanks! Thanks for donating. Thanks for considering the inclusion of the Foundation in your will or estate plan. And thanks for supporting Randolph County's endowment.

With a background in nonprofit fundraising, she was an ideal fit for several positions within the Board. Christen immersed herself in these volunteer opportunities, making their value to her clear to then boyfriend, now husband, Brian Smith. For the next few years, she served on the Executive Committee in the capacity of Vice President (2014) and President (2015, 2016). Following this, she joined the Asset Development and Events Committees, putting her previous experience to great use.

Christen recently celebrated two milestones: 10 years of practicing in Randolph County and the beginning of her 10th year on the Foundation Board. Personally, her involvement has made Randolph County feel like home, positively impacting her decision to build a practice and raise a family here. As a community member, she claims that being part of CFRC made her a more well-rounded citizen, informing her about both opportunities and needs around the county that she would not have otherwise been exposed to, growing her appreciation for the possibilities available, and meeting amazing like-minded contacts. Professionally, having this perspective, specifically knowing resources that might be helpful to others, has been beneficial to her practice as well. Overall, Christen consistently conveyed that her time on the Foundation Board has been made enjoyable by those she has worked alongside and the overwhelming generosity of "neighbors" to the community.

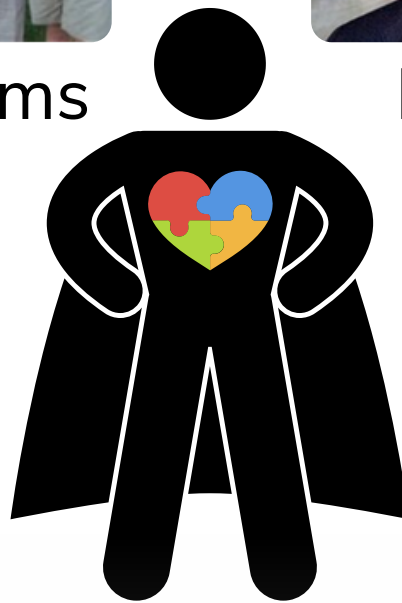

IAC Grants

In 1997, the Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) and 12 community-based organizations jointly established the Indiana Regional Arts Partnerships (RAP), a collaborative project to enhance support for arts and cultural activities statewide, especially in underserved areas. The RAPs enhance the delivery of services, move the decision-making about IAC funds closer to you, and are the cornerstone of the IAC's structure.

As the Region 5 Regional Arts Partner, the Community Foundation of Randolph County provides resources and information for arts in Blackford, Delaware, Fayette, Grant, Henry, Jay, Madison, Randolph, Rush, Union, and Wayne counties. This initiative is made possible in part by the Indiana Arts Commission, with funds from the Indiana General Assembly and the National Endowment for the Arts.

Exciting Happenings



The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), Indiana Humanities' federal partner, announced a special initiative called A More Perfect Union. The purpose of the initiative is to advance civic education and to prepare to commemorate the 250th anniversary in 2026 of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. As part of the initiative, the NEH is providing state humanities councils with funding for programs that "deepen public understanding of the American experience—in all its complexities—and enhance the knowledge, skills, and capacities needed to sustain a thriving republic." To promote civic education and to help address the civic-health challenges that Indiana faces, Indiana Humanities has chosen to use their A More Perfect Union funding to offer grants to tax-exempt organizations for supporting civic programming in the state of Indiana.

The Community Foundation of Randolph County has been awarded one of those grants. The funds will be used for what we are calling "Ideals of A More Perfect Union."
