A pearl is formed when a grain of sand slips in between the mantle and the shell of an oyster. This creates an irritation to the mantle, and to protect itself, the oyster then carefully coats the grain layer by layer with nacre – also called the mother-of-pearl – a mineral substance that’s used to create the shell. 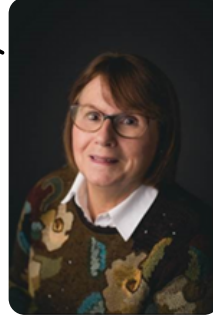

# Faces at the Foundation Spotlight



Janice Powers was raised in Randolph County, spending her childhood surrounded by many community members as her parents Dallas and Doris Mills established, owned, and operated The Farmland Locker Plant. This early connection to the area contributed to her decision to stay local for a rewarding career in both banking and community involvement. Janice began this journey by joining Peoples Loan & Trust Bank in 1974. During her time in the field, she provided leadership in a variety of roles and departments and played an instrumental part in many bank conversions. To best fulfill her responsibilities, she continued her education by completing classes on topics from banking to coaching and leadership through the Indiana Bankers Association, I.U. Kelley School of Business, and Ball State University. Janice retired in 2020 from the position of Marketing President & Regional Sales Manager at Old National Bank after 46 years in banking. She credits this career with opening the door to many opportunities to contribute her time and vast experience to the county. These endeavors include serving as a board member for LifeStream, Habitat for Humanity, Senior Advisory Council, and Chamber of Commerce (past President); volunteering with the United Way, Second Harvest Food Bank, Cancer Society, 4-H, and Salvation Army; and mentoring students with disabilities at Ball State University.

Janice began her involvement with the Community Foundation of Randolph County in 2014 as a board member. She has since served as a member of the finance committee, Lilly committee, grants committee, scholarship committee, and as treasurer of the board. With her background, finance and grants committees seem extremely intuitive. Janice explained that scholarships and Lilly committees were also obvious options to her. At the bank, she often got to mentor less experienced employees on personal and professional matters; in the same way she hoped to encourage students to follow their dreams in terms of education and career path, fulfilling their individual potentials. Additionally, Janice and her husband, Thom, always had a desire to start a Charitable Fund to assist non-profit organizations and students in Randolph County. They chose to do so in 2015 at CFRC with the Thomas L. & Janice A. Powers Family Charitable Fund. This endowment will continue to grow for the benefit of posterity, with the help of their son Brandon and daughter Kim (husband Greg and son Bodhi). Thank you Janice for all you have done and continue to do for Randolph County!

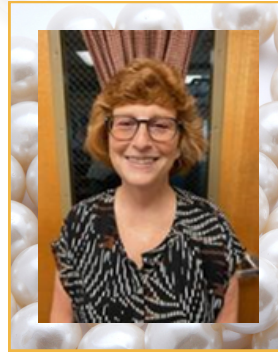

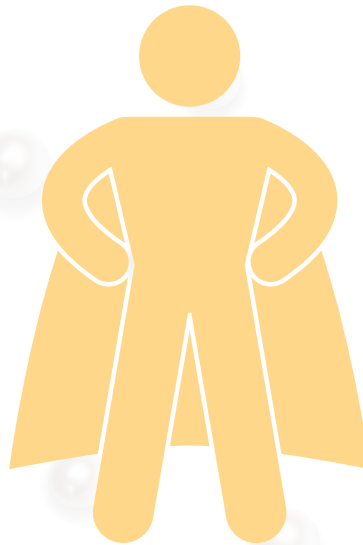

To start the events of the evening, guests were welcomed by Nick Dunham, Grants and Community Impact Officer. He was followed by board member, Jane Flesher, whom offered a prayer before dinner which was provided by Roots along with the famous Wick's Pies for dessert.

The first spotlight of the night was on Thomas Herold, and his newest fund at the foundation. Thomas opened up a fund to benefit the employees of St. Vincent Randolph Hospital. This fund will provide for educational opportunities to the hospital staff. It is named the Herold Healthcare Education Fund. Tom and his late wife Betty are excellent examples of always giving back, they encourage others to give and to be an active part of their communities and raise their families to serve others.

The next spotlight of the night fell on the IAC Region 5 FY23 grantees. The foundation is the IAC Region 5 Arts Partner providing resources and information for the 11 counties in the Region 5 district.

To follow, Autumn Dixon, Scholarships & Community Development Officer and CFRC Community Advisor, Cathy Stephen Miller discussed and announced the Forum of Funders. The Forum of Funders is an extension of the Cultivating Communities partnership between Randolph County United and the Community Foundation of Randolph County. The initial phases of the Forum will be a three year pilot program, that currently consists of nine organizations or individuals whom have voting rights.

To have these rights one must commit \$10,000 a year for three years. Current voting members are; Randolph County United, The Winchester Foundation, Community Foundation of Randolph County, Randolph County Commissioners, Randolph County Council, Chris & Doreen Culy, Reid Health, the City of Union City, and the City of Winchester. The Forum is in the beginning phases and plans to have their first meeting in early 2023.

Each year we are so grateful to have the opportunity to share with our community the impact we were able to make largely thanks to their generosity, impactful giving, and dedication to the Randolph County Community. Our puzzle truly isn't complete without all of you!

# Donors Spotlight

Bettye Monks



Bettye Monks has been a resident of Randolph County for over 90 years, always treating her neighbors and community as extended family. After working for Farm Bureau, the Boston Store, and the County Courthouse, she delved into deeper involvement with many worthy organizations and endeavors including the Winchester Friends Church, Food Pantry, Ag Days, 4-H, Angel Tree, Cancer Society, Fly-in Breakfast, Hospital Auxiliary, and community meal delivery. Bettye has personally prepared over 1,500 apple dumplings for the church during Mardi Gras. It is obvious why she was recognized as a Randolph County Hero through the Community Foundation in 2016.

Bettye's relationship with CFRC goes far beyond this; she created the Merrett R. Monks Memorial Scholarship Fund with us in honor of her son's memory. This scholarship is intended to support students who want to enter skilled trades as her late son did. When Merrett graduated high school he turned down scholarship offers from traditional universities to go to General Motors Institute. Despite doing well academically, he decided that something more tangible would make him happier, so he left GMI to become an apprentice electrician with GM. Merrett took classes that culminated in degrees at Purdue and Indiana Wesleyan Universities while working toward becoming a Master Electrician. Bettye wishes to recognize and support people that choose to take different paths. She and her family consistently give to the fund, fostering its growth from a one-time scholarship to a renewable scholarship.

Bettye's simple answer to why she cares so much about the well-being of Randolph County: she has spent her whole life here and, as a result, wants to better her home. Her daughter Kathryn elaborated that she was "brought up to believe that if [she] was aware of something that needed to be done, [she] should do it," going on to say that her mother had no fancy philosophy about giving, but plainly instilled the view in her children that caring for others was a basic responsibility. Perhaps most telling of Bettye's character and core values is her response to being asked why she believes that philanthropy is important: "I never lost anything by helping someone else."

## **Contribution to the Randolph County Promise Community Fund**

EDPR, a global leader in the renewable energy sector, began its partnership with CFRC with a \$20,000 contribution to the Randolph County Promise Community Fund, one of the funds used to support the 529 CollegeChoice Promise program for our county.

## **EDP Renewables Charitable Fund**

This fund was established by EDPR to provide general support to community organizations and their activities at the discretion of the CFRC Board of Directors. It was created with an initial contribution of \$125,000 in 2019.

## **Riverstart Union Township Endowment Fund**

This fund was established by EDPR to fund projects and programs that benefit the residents of Union Township for generations to come. Possible projects could include parks and town beautification, athletic leagues, recreational trail improvements, first responder needs, veteran support, festivals & fairs and cultural events, food banks and shelters, and other nonprofits serving the Township. \$20,000 was awarded in Fall 2022, with additional funding opportunities every year. Over the next 15 years, EDPR will contribute a total of \$360,000 to the endowment fund.

## **Riverstart Union Township Utility Assistance Fund**

This fund was established by EDPR to help residents of Union Township facing financial hardship. It is a grant program administered by the Union Township Trustee. Those in need of assistance may receive payment to their utility company for part or all of their bill. EDPR provided a contribution of \$100,000 to start this fund.

# IAC Grants

In 1997, the Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) and 12 community-based organizations jointly established the Indiana Regional Arts Partnerships (RAP), a collaborative project to enhance support for arts and cultural activities statewide, especially in underserved areas. The RAPs enhance the delivery of services, move the decision-making about IAC funds closer to you, and are the cornerstone of the IAC's structure.

As the Region 5 Regional Arts Partner, the Community Foundation of Randolph County provides resources and information for arts in Blackford, Delaware, Fayette, Grant, Henry, Jay, Madison, Randolph, Rush, Union, and Wayne counties. This initiative is made possible in part by the Indiana Arts Commission, with funds from the Indiana General Assembly and the National Endowment for the Arts.

The following organizations were awarded grants during 2022 for the 2023 fiscal year.

- **8Twelve Coalition (FS: Open Door Health Services)** | Muncie, IN | \$3,900
- **Anderson Fine Arts Foundation, Inc (DBA Anderson Museum of Art)** | Anderson, IN | \$9,108

The Annual Women's Fund Brunch and Auction took place on Saturday, August 13 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Winchester with Judge Pat Riley as the featured speaker. The auction created \$10,500 in proceeds to further the efforts of the Fund to empower women and children. Art judge Timothy Wells awarded first-place and the \$500 award to Sheryl Thurston for her work titled "Pink Ladies." Second- and third-place and the associated cash prizes were awarded to works by JoAnna Price and Grace Bailey, respectively. During 2022, the Fund granted \$5,486 to three local organizations serving Randolph County women and children.

## *More About Our New Funds*

### **Riverstart Union Township Endowment Fund**

This fund was established by EDPR to fund projects and programs that benefit the residents of Union Township for generations to come. Possible projects could include parks and town beautification, athletic leagues, recreational trail improvements, first responder needs, veteran support, festivals & fairs and cultural events, food banks and shelters, and nonprofits serving the Township. \$20,000 will be available Fall 2022, with annual funding opportunities every year. Over the next 15 years EDPR will contribute a total of \$360,000 to the endowment.

### **Riverstart Union Township Utility Assistance Fund**

This fund was established by EDPR to help residents of Union Township facing financial hardship. It is a grant program administered by the Union Township Trustee. Those in need of assistance may receive payment to their utility company for part or all of their bill. EDPR is making a contribution of \$100,000 to this need.

# Exciting Happenings



The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), Indiana Humanities' federal partner, announced a special initiative called A More Perfect Union. The purpose of the initiative is to advance civic education and to prepare to commemorate the 250th anniversary in 2026 of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. As part of the initiative, the NEH is providing state humanities councils with funding for programs that "deepen public understanding of the American experience—in all its complexities—and enhance the knowledge, skills, and capacities needed to sustain a thriving republic." To promote civic education and to help address the civic-health challenges that Indiana faces, Indiana Humanities has chosen to use their A More Perfect Union funding to offer grants to tax-exempt organizations for supporting civic programming in the state of Indiana.

The Community Foundation of Randolph County has been awarded one of those grants. The funds were used for what we are calling "Ideals of A More Perfect Union." We hosted a series of three lectures at the Towne Square Community Center. The first lecture, "Education & Civil Discourse in a More Perfect Union" by Dr. Kenneth Holland, took place on January 27. The second, "The Economics of a More Perfect Union" by Dr. Michael Hicks, took place on March 9. The third, "Historical Perspectives on a More Perfect Union" by Dr. Steve Ealy, took place on May 11. A culminating colloquium is set to occur at a future date. The programming thus far drew a total of 152 community members. 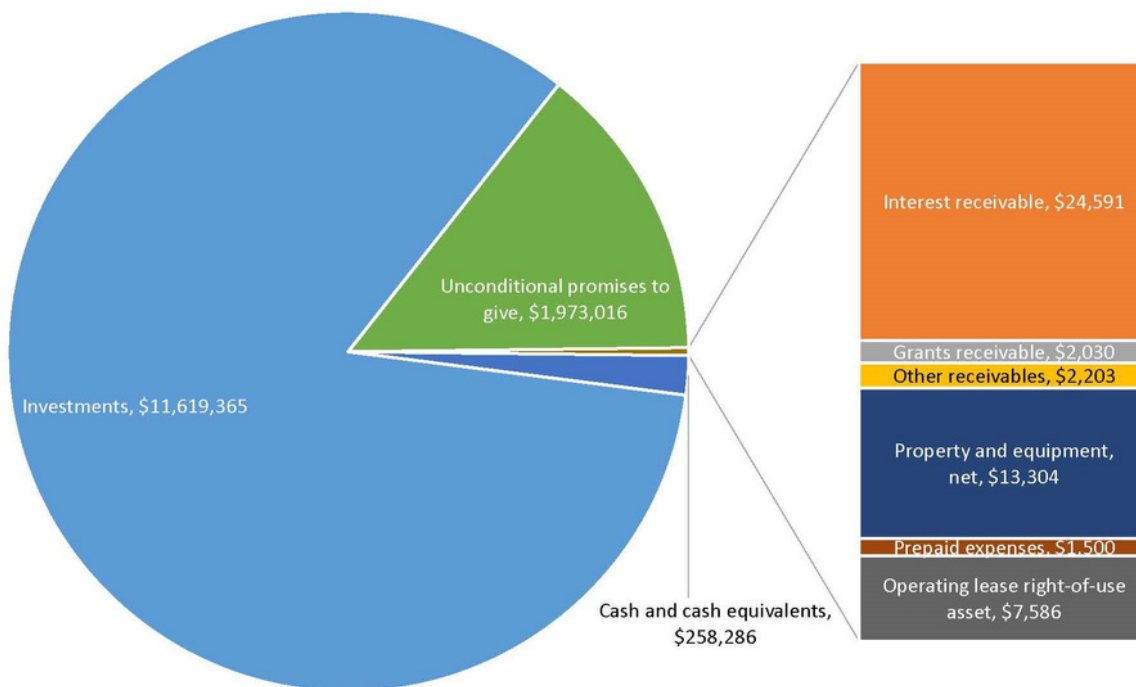

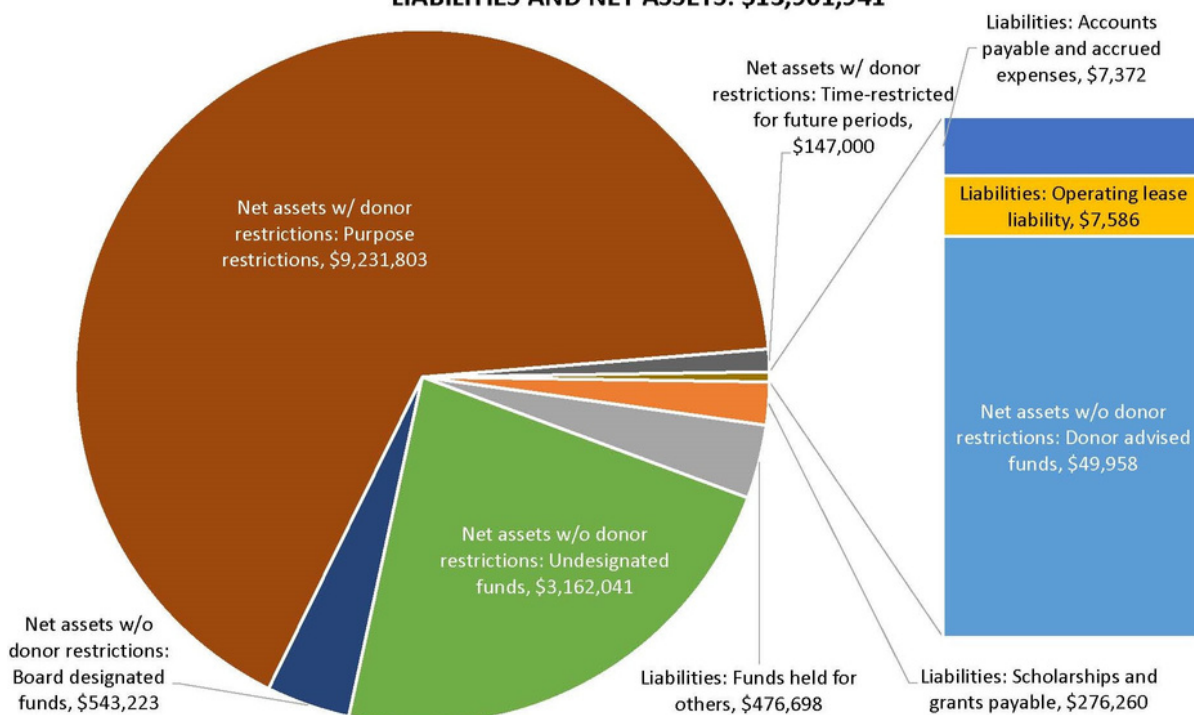

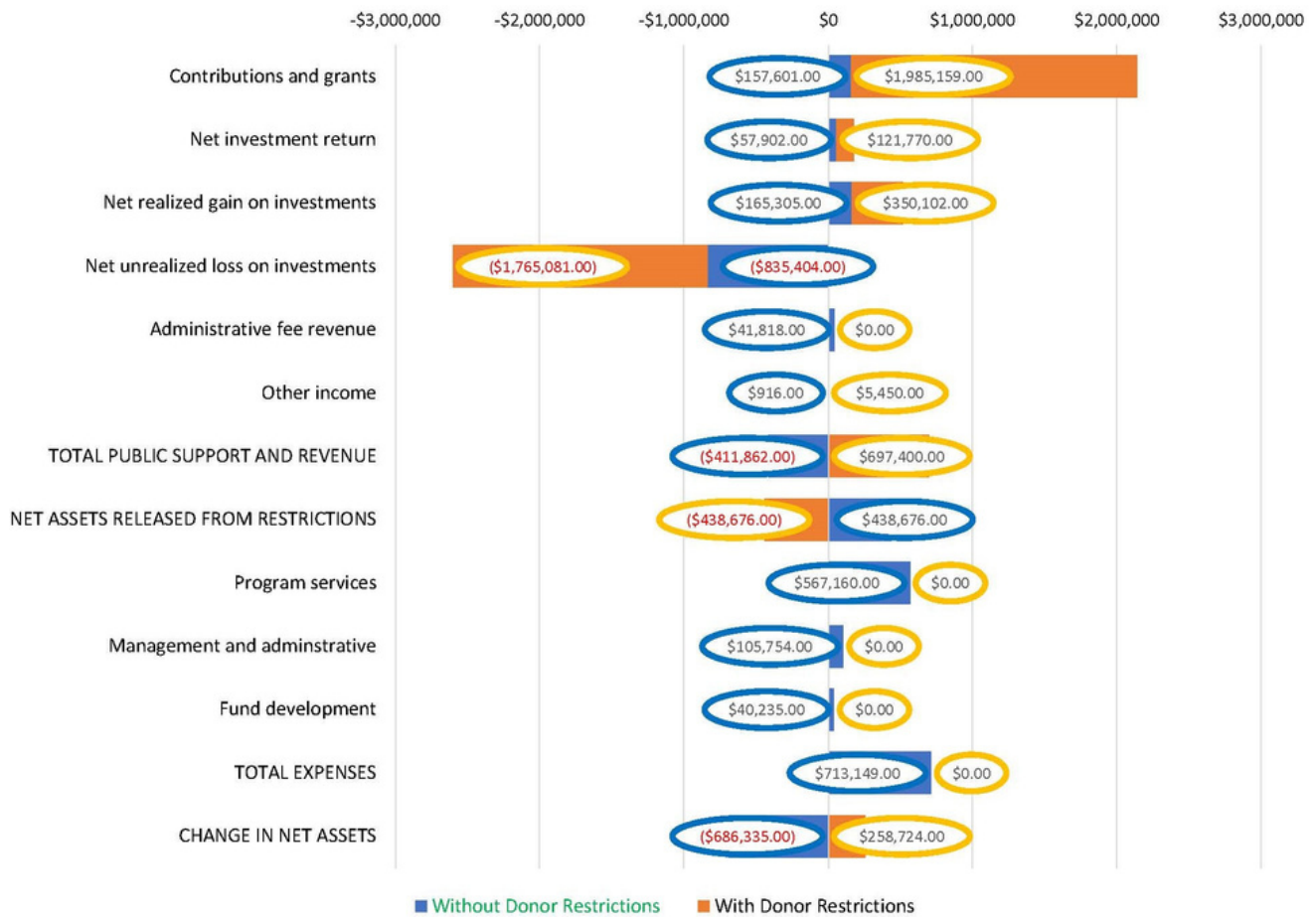
