July 1, 2025

Once scholarship recipients can provide their college Student ID Number, they must submit a College Information Form to the Community Foundation by this date, or the scholarship(s) will be awarded to an alternate student. Please note that you have the option to defer your scholarship for up to one academic year if you desire.

What to Expect 10-Step Application

Step 1: Contact Information

Let's get the easy stuff out of the way! Name, address, phone number, email, etc.



Step 2: College/University Information

It's exciting to think about your next steps! In this section you'll answer what type of school you plan on attending, name of the college/university, type of degree you're pursuing, etc.

Step 3: Financial Information

Financial Need

Only financial need based scholarships utilize this information. While there are many scholarships that have financial need as a requirement, we also oversee many that do not. We encourage you to complete this section for your opportunity to meet the criteria for as many scholarships as possible.

Federal Student Aid Estimator

You'll be asked to use the Federal Student Aid Estimator tool, which can be found at: www.studentaid.gov/aid-estimator/.

These Yes-No questions are scholarship-specific, and help to determine which applicants qualify for specific scholarships.

Step 10:

Essays and Letters of Recommendation

Only 1 essay is required. You'll be asked to upload up to 4 essays and up to 2 letters of recommendation.

Information on Essays

Future Goals Essay (Required)

 Please upload an essay about the goals you hope to reach in the future.

Important Qualities/Attributes (Optional)

 Please upload an essay sharing your thoughts about the qualities of attitude, initiative, incentive, worthiness, citizenship, cooperation, and the importance of these attributes.

Leadership (Optional)

 Please upload an essay about leadership and how you've proven to be a leader in your high school career.

Karen Hardwick Scholarship Essay (Optional)

 ONLY MONROE CENTRAL STUDENTS ELIGIBLE. Please upload an essay about your character, as modeled by Karen Hardwick. Karen, a graduate of Monroe Central High School, worked at the school for many years, teaching responsibility, honesty, and work ethic. She was also involved in the community, active in the Parker City United Methodist Church, served on the Church Council, and assisted with VBS and Youth Group. She was also dedicated to service, spending many hours alongside the friends she made serving.


Letters of Recommendation (Optional)




You'll receive an email that looks like this:
