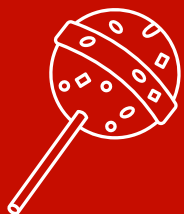

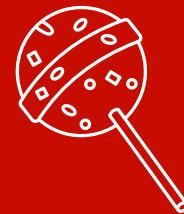

Executive Message



Celebrating 30 years of stewardship for our community

Our recent theme at the Community Foundation has been “Our Donors Are Sweet.” The truth of this description has been proven many times in the past year! The Foundation staff and board members are continually amazed and grateful for the generosity of our community. It is an honor and a privilege to have ignited generosity in Randolph County for thirty years!

New funds have been established and existing funds have grown thanks to the generosity of our donors. The Diana Fahl Science Scholarship Fund was new this year and encourages Randolph County students to continue their studies in science. In addition, a bequest from the Frances I. Wood estate created a new scholarship fund and was one of the largest single gifts to the CFRC in Foundation history!

A special thank you to Chris and Doreen Culy for their very generous donation to their Chris & Doreen Culy Family Charitable Fund. Their most recent gift more than doubled the amount of their fund to support grantmaking to local not-for-profit organizations.

Thanks also to Joel and Jane Flesher for hosting an informational event on the Rural Randolph Cares fund. The farming community is very strong in Randolph County and is highly valued by the Foundation. We are glad to partner with members of the agriculture profession to help provide a tax-preferential way to meet charitable goals.

In late 2023, the Community Foundation was given a special opportunity to bring \$750,000 into our community. Lilly Endowment, Inc. announced the Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow initiative for community foundations (GIFT VIII). Through GIFT VIII, the Foundation applied for matching dollars to help grow unrestricted endowment funds with a \$2 to \$1 match. The Community Foundation would need to ignite generosity to raise at least \$375,000 between October 1, 2023, and December 31, 2025, to capture the full match. Such unrestricted gifts, which are matched at the 2-to-1 basis while funds are available, will assist in maximizing the opportunity Lilly Endowment is providing.

We are “sweet” on the people of Randolph County. We celebrate the loyalty and the generosity observed in our donors. We look forward to the next 30 years of working together. To follow the advice of John Wesley when he said:

*“Do all the good we can,
for all the people we can,
in whatever way we can.”*

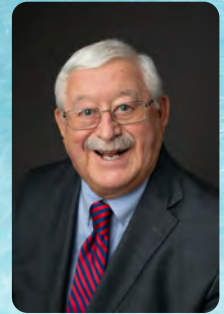

The Randolph County community has been **Louise Hart's** "adopted home" since she and her husband relocated to Winchester in 2005. She started serving on the Community Foundation of Randolph County's Board of Directors in 2016.

Born on a farm in Southeast Missouri, she is the youngest of seven children. In 1949 her family moved to Columbia, Missouri, with the select purpose of making sure the children received higher education for which her parents could claim success as Louise received her BSN (RN) in 1963 from the University of Missouri. In addition to graduating from college in 1963, Louise also married Jack B. Hart.

As both she and her husband possess PhDs -- Louise's from the IU School of Nursing and Jack's from the University of Missouri in Biomedical Mechanical Engineering -- Louise has been an enthusiastic supporter of the Community Foundation's Fund for Education and the scholarship program. "As my parents understood, higher education can be impactful on a young person's future. I am thankful for the opportunity to have supported efforts to provide scholarships to graduates of Randolph County schools," Louise shared.

In 1970, Jack and Louise moved their family to Indianapolis, raising their two children, Garrett Lee, recently of Missoula, Montana, and Elizabeth Louise, of Winchester.

Elizabeth is married to lifelong Winchester resident Rory Helms, and she earned her bachelor's degree from DePauw University and is an MSN (RN), CFNP with a practice in Union City. Their daughter, Riley Lee Helms, followed in her father's footsteps, graduating from Winchester Community High School and Indiana University. Riley currently resides in Washington, D.C.

Relocating to Winchester to be closer to their daughter and her family, Louise wanted to be engaged in the community, which led to her joining Elizabeth in her Girl Scout Troop activities as well as serving as a member of the Board of Directors of the Randolph County YMCA for 9 years with six of those as President. Louise's other community volunteer positions include serving as a member of the Randolph County Health Department and the Ascension St. Vincent Hospital Foundation.

At the Community Foundation of Randolph County, Louise has served as a member of the Grants, Nominations, and Women's Fund Committees. "Serving on committees at the Community Foundation has been an honor," Louise said. "With the Grants Committee, we get to give away money to deserving nonprofits to support their efforts in our community. With the Women's Fund Committee, we plan and host a party [the Women's Fund Brunch and Auction] to raise money and then give that money to nonprofits supporting women and children in Randolph County. It's a great time!"

On Thursday, November 2, 2023, the Community Foundation gathered with its community partners at the new Willow's Edge Event Center to celebrate another successful year of bringing people and resources together to strengthen the quality of life for the residents of Randolph County. The event, catered by Pete's Catering, included recognition of numerous local and regional grant recipients. In recognizing local grant recipients, the Community Foundation distributed checks totaling more than \$80,000 to nineteen (19) organizations that provide support to residents of Randolph County. As an Indiana Arts Commission's Regional Arts Partner (RAP), the Community Foundation had the honor of celebrating the FY24 Arts Organizational Support (AOS) grantees and the FY24 Arts Project Support (APS) grantees for Region 5. Additionally, for the first time since becoming a RAP, the Community Foundation was able to honor a Governor's Arts Award Recipient: Shaun Dingwerth of the Richmond Art Museum was selected to receive that prestigious recognition for 2023. Other portions of the event's program included updates on the Randolph County Promise program, which incentivizes and supports Randolph County families to save for their children's post-secondary education, and a presentation on the Randolph County Heroes program, which provides an opportunity to honor an individual or organization that has had a major positive impact on Randolph County. The final portion of the evening was a reflection on the Community Foundation's 30 years of bringing people and resources together for the benefit of Randolph County residents. From its humble beginnings as the brainchild of a few concerned citizens to its present status of awarding over \$300,000 in scholarships and over \$160,000 in community grants, the Community Foundation of Randolph County has been thankful for the pearls that are its donors and other community partners.

Welcoming Indiana's Next Generation (WINGS) Fund

Did you know that Winchester's Goodrich Park is home to a splash pad?

When the splash pad was finished, it not only marked the arrival of a new place for summer fun but also the first project completed with funds distributed through the Welcoming Indiana's Next Generation (WINGS) Fund.



Established July 31, 2018, the WINGS Fund was designed to support projects and charitable causes "to enhance the quality of life in the Winchester, Indiana community." The impetus behind the creation of the Fund was a decision of the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCDA) to assist with the retirement of debt related to the IHCDA-loan-supported Winchester facility housing Volunteers of America of Indiana's "Fresh Start Program."

Instead of payments to IHCDA, the City of Winchester, Volunteers of America Ohio & Indiana, the Community Foundation, and IHCDA have agreements that direct annual contributions to the WINGS Fund in exchange for debt forgiveness on the IHCDA loan. Following the last of the scheduled contributions, the WINGS Fund will have an endowed balance of nearly \$300,000, which will provide an annual source of revenue "to enhance the quality of life in the Winchester, Indiana community" through various projects.

"As a service provider in Randolph County dedicated to maternal and infant health and healthy communities, Volunteers of America Ohio & Indiana is proud to deepen its local commitment through Welcoming Indiana's Next Generation (WINGS) Fund investments to help ensure all individuals and the community thrive today and well into the future," stated John R. von Arx III, President & CEO of Volunteers of America Ohio & Indiana.

So, when you hear the laughter and shouts of excitement rising from children enjoying the Goodrich Park Splash Pad in years to come, remember that those signs of a care-free childhood experience were delivered, in part, by WINGS -- the Welcoming Indiana's Next Generation Fund.



IAC Grants

In 1997, the Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) and 12 community-based organizations jointly established the Indiana Regional Arts Partnerships (RAP), a collaborative project to enhance support for arts and cultural activities statewide, especially in underserved areas. The RAPs enhance the delivery of services, move the decision-making about IAC funds closer to you, and are the cornerstone of the IAC's structure.

As the Region 5 Regional Arts Partner, the Community Foundation of Randolph County provides resources and information for arts in Blackford, Delaware, Fayette, Grant, Henry, Jay, Madison, Randolph, Rush, Union, and Wayne counties. This initiative is made possible in part by the Indiana Arts Commission, with funds from the Indiana General Assembly and the National Endowment for the Arts.

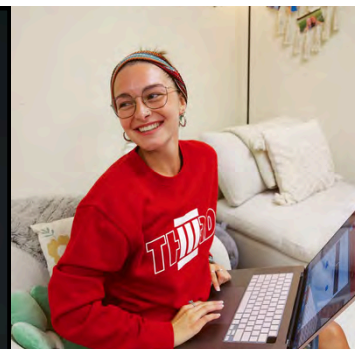

GIFT VIII PLANNING GRANT: TRAILS MASTER PLAN

The Community Foundation of Randolph County has received a \$50,000 planning grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc. for the purpose of developing a Trails Master Plan. These grants are designed to help community foundations collaborate with local partners to engage broad and diverse stakeholders in their communities and deepen their understanding of their communities' highest-priority challenges and opportunities. In 2024, Community Foundation of Randolph County will have the opportunity to request funding to implement strategic initiatives and activities developed during the planning period that address especially compelling needs in Randolph County.

Building upon the efforts of the Trails Committee formed through the Cultivating Community initiative, the Community Foundation will partner with an engineering firm to develop a Trails Master Plan. The process of creating the Trails Master Plan will include an initial meeting, data collection on existing and planned projects, stakeholder meetings, a public workshop, a public open house, and a final plan presentation.

The creation of the Trails Master Plan will support various entities within the county as they seek additional funding to enhance the network of trails available to residents and visitors of Randolph County, including connections to the Gateway Trail in Union City as well as to the Wilbur Wright and Cardinal Greenway trails near Losantville.
