Thomas Herold Fund for Health Care Education

When you and your late wife spent your careers at the local hospital, what more could you do to ensure the services provided by the hospital continue to meet the needs of the community?

For Tom Herold, the answer was simple: establish the Thomas Herold Fund for Health Care Education here at the Community Foundation of Randolph County to support educational initiatives at Ascension St. Vincent Randolph Hospital.

Established in 2022, the Thomas Herold Fund for Health Care Education is an endowed fund, which ensures that funding to support the purpose of the fund – educational initiatives at Winchester's hospital – will be available forever.

The first grant award from the Herold Fund occurred this spring, and the funds were put to use immediately. According to Shelley Miller, the former Administrator and Chief Nursing Officer at Ascension St. Vincent Randolph, the grant funding was used to support training for all hospital associates on safety, trauma response, and active shooter response.

Future gifts to the Herold Fund – from Tom Herold or anyone else – will build the endowment from which earnings are drawn to fund annual grants.

The Thomas Herold Fund for Health Care Education is another example of the Community Foundation of Randolph County fulfilling its mission to bring people and resources together to strengthen the quality of life, both now and in the future, for the residents of Randolph County.

Relief Fund Update

We want to express our deepest gratitude to everyone who has contributed to the disaster recovery efforts following the March 14, 2024, event. Thanks to the incredible generosity of individuals, businesses, organizations, and churches, along with successful grant applications, the Relief Fund has raised a total of \$641,515.44 (including pledges) as of mid-May 2025. It's important to note that these funds are entirely from donations and grants; we did not receive FEMA assistance. Also as of mid-May 2025, \$257,358.79 has been disbursed and \$307,896.01 has been allocated to assist those in need, leaving a current fund balance of \$76,260.64. Of the allocated funds, \$78,600 are estimated, and this figure is subject to change. Considering the remaining open cases and the amount of funds currently available, it's highly unlikely that enough funds have been raised.

Case Management and Remaining Challenges

Our case management team has been diligently working to address the needs of affected residents. Over 440 cases have been opened, with over 50 of those cases meeting the bylaws for assistance. The remaining cases were successfully closed through other means, such as personal insurance, SBA loans, State Disaster Response Fund support, or the help of Good Samaritans. We've also seen instances of cases being reopened, such as when insurance coverage falls short of expectations.

Building for the Future: COAD

The Long-Term Recovery Team was established following a proven framework provided by Jane Crady, Coordinator of Disaster Preparedness & Response with Catholic Charities Archdiocese of Indianapolis. This structure, designed to effectively manage disaster recovery, has guided the efforts in assisting the uninsured and underinsured. A key component of this initial planning was the vision for a Community Organization Active in Disasters (COAD). The goal of a COAD is to create a localized fund to ensure that donations directly address local issues caused by future disasters, rather than being used for national organizational overhead. While our primary focus remains on assisting those impacted by the March 14 disaster, any remaining funds (should there be any) will be used to establish a COAD for Randolph County. This proactive step will significantly benefit our community by ensuring a pre-established disaster response framework for any future events. We're grateful to the Heart of Indiana United Way, a vital partner since the beginning of this recovery process, who will be instrumental in helping us achieve this goal.

Cultivating Community

The "Cultivating Community" initiative continues to be a driving force for positive change and growth throughout Randolph County. As a vital partnership between Randolph County United, the Community Foundation of Randolph County, Ball State University's Indiana Communities Institute, and our local community, we are dedicated to addressing challenges and pursuing opportunities that enhance the quality of life for all residents. Our efforts span critical areas: housing & blight, the drug epidemic, improving broadband infrastructure, enhancing education, and improving quality of life, all driven by the ideas and dedication of our community members.

A cornerstone of the Cultivating Community approach is our bimonthly sessions, where residents come together to brainstorm projects and improvements, big or small. We're proud to share some inspiring successes that have come out of these sessions. The non-profit Gracie's Gift was formed directly out of a community member's vision to tackle the stray cat problem in our county. Another example is a recent community cleanup called "Lend A Hand, Clean The Land" that mobilized over 100 dedicated volunteers to beautify various areas across Randolph County.

At a recent session held at Northblock Coffee in Winchester, attendees showcased the diverse interests and priorities of our community. Four key areas were discussed, primarily fitting under the "Quality of Life" umbrella:

Community Events: Participants shared ideas for exciting community events, including the potential for a "Fun, Fitness, and Facts of Randolph County" series. **** Community Cleanup:** We reviewed the success of our cleanup and began planning for next year. **** Arts:** We explored avenues for arts and culture, including community theater and existing summer concerts. **** Outdoor Activities:** Participants expressed interest in outdoor activities like multi-use trails, kayaking, a community garden, and a downtown green space.



The momentum continues, and we eagerly invite you to be a part of it! Our Cultivating Community sessions happen every other month, so please follow our website and Facebook page to stay aware. This is a fantastic opportunity for individuals of all ages to contribute their ideas, connect with neighbors, and actively participate in shaping a better future for Randolph County. Come share your vision and help us continue to cultivate community!
